
Omitted A

Falkland Islands Dependencies

1946 1d 'thick map' definitive.

A in Alexander Land completely missing, R6/5.

Unlisted in both SG and Murray Payne.




Wrong letter

Indian Convention States - Patiala

1885 overprint on 1882 Indian stamp where the P of PUTTIALLA was printed as an A.

Occurs on R9/12, SG 8a.



Split A variety in GV 'Postage Postage' keytype

Gambia 1912-22 ½ d mint Occurs at R8/3, SG 86c



Seychelles 1912-16 15c used R8/3, SG 75a



Damaged A

Newfoundland

1941 3c damaged A.

Occurs at R5/9, SG 278b



Damaged A

Leeward Islands

1907-11 2 ½ d bright blue

Occurs on both panes at R6/1, SG 40a.



Australia

1914-20 1d carmine red

Only on plate 4 left pane at R10/6, SG 21cj



Wrong font or letter

Malaya – Straits Settlements 1922 Malaya Borneo Exhibition overprint Wrong font for first A in Malaya, SG 253d



Morocco Agencies 1898 overprinted on Gibraltar issue. V substituted for A of Agencies, SG 3cb.



Inserted A

Ireland

1922-23 Free State overprint.

The last AT of SAORSTAT failed to print at R15/12 and it was inserted by hand, SG 53d



Broken type.

Natal 1985 HALF on 1d surcharge overprint.

The A of HALF was broken, together with the diagnostic longer left stroke to the H (the broken bit?), SG 125b.



Misplaced type

Ceylon 1890 5c on 15c surcharge overprint.

Occurs at R1/5 where the gap between T and A of POSTAGE was misplaced, SG 233i.



Forgotten stops after an A

Tripolitania 1948 1L on ½ d emerald No stop after A in BMA, R1/11 SG TD1a.



St. Lucia

1930 1d Postage Due No stop after A in LUCIA, R9/2, SG D1d
